

## The Role of Digital Transformation in Promoting Sustainable Tourism in Algeria under the Tourism Master Plan Framework (Vision 2030).

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### Abstract :

This study examines The Role of Digital Transformation in Promoting Sustainable Tourism in Algeria within the framework of the Tourism Master Plan. The main objective is to analyze how digital technologies can support the implementation of the Vision 2030 Tourism Master Plan to achieve economic growth, service quality enhancement, environmental sustainability, and regional equity in Algeria. The research highlights that digital transformation has a significant impact on operational efficiency, facilitates data-driven decision-making, enhances international marketing, and strengthens the competitiveness of the tourism sector. It also supports sustainable management of natural and cultural resources and promotes balanced regional development. Key findings indicate that integrating digital tools with strategic policies is essential for achieving a modern, sustainable, and globally competitive tourism sector in Algeria. The study provides actionable recommendations for policymakers, investors, and tourism stakeholders to leverage technology for sustainable tourism growth.

**الملخص:** تهدف هذه الدراسة إلى بحث دور التحول الرقمي في تعزيز السياحة المستدامة في الجزائر في إطار المخطط التوجيهي للسياحة. ويتمثل الهدف الرئيسي في تحليل كيفية مساهمة التقنيات الرقمية في دعم تنفيذ المخطط التوجيهي للسياحة (رؤية 2030) بما يحقق النمو الاقتصادي، وتحسين جودة الخدمات السياحية، وتعزيز الاستدامة البيئية، وتحقيق العدالة الإقليمية في الجزائر. وتبرز الدراسة أن التحول الرقمي يُحدث أثراً بالغ الأهمية في رفع الكفاءة التشغيلية، وتسهيل اتخاذ القرار المبني على البيانات، وتعزيز التسويق السياحي الدولي، وتقوية تنافسية القطاع السياحي. كما يساهم في الإدارة المستدامة للموارد الطبيعية والثقافية، ويدعم تحقيق تنمية إقليمية متوازنة. وتشير النتائج الرئيسية إلى أن دمج الأدوات الرقمية مع السياسات الاستراتيجية يعد شرطاً أساسياً لبناء قطاع سياحي حديث، مستدام، وقادر على المنافسة عالمياً في الجزائر. وتقدم الدراسة جملة من التوصيات العملية الموجهة لصناع القرار والمستثمرين ومختلف الفاعلين في القطاع السياحي من أجل توظيف التكنولوجيا في دعم النمو السياحي المستدام.

## 1. Introduction

Tourism has emerged as a key driver of economic diversification and cultural exchange, particularly in countries with rich natural and cultural heritage such as Algeria. In recent years, the paradigm of sustainable tourism development has gained prominence as a means to balance economic growth with environmental preservation and social inclusion. Simultaneously, digital transformation has revolutionized the tourism sector worldwide, reshaping how destinations are marketed, managed, and experienced. In Algeria, the Tourism Master Plan (SDAT) provides a strategic framework for developing the sector with an emphasis on sustainability and competitiveness. Integrating digital transformation within this framework offers significant

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opportunities to enhance service quality, improve resource efficiency, and strengthen the country's positioning as a sustainable destination. However, challenges remain in aligning technological innovation with the goals of sustainable development. This study examines the role of digital transformation in promoting sustainable tourism development in Algeria within the framework of the Tourism Master Plan.

**- Problem of Study :**

to what extent can digital transformation support the promotion of sustainable tourism development in Algeria within the framework of the Tourism Master Plan, and what mechanisms are required to align digital initiatives with sustainability goals?

**- Hypothesis:**

Digital transformation significantly enhances the sustainable development of Algeria's tourism sector by improving operational efficiency, promoting high-quality services, supporting environmental sustainability, and strengthening the sector's competitiveness under the framework of the 2030 Tourism Master Plan.

**- Importance of the Study :**

This study is important as it sheds light on how digital transformation can be integrated into Algeria's Tourism Master Plan to foster sustainable tourism development. It contributes academically by filling a gap in research on the link between digitalization and sustainability in the Algerian context. Practically, it provides insights for policymakers and tourism stakeholders on leveraging digital tools to enhance competitiveness, efficiency, and sustainability. The findings are expected to serve as a roadmap for aligning digital initiatives with sustainable development goals in the tourism sector.

**- Study Objective :**

The main objective of this study is to examine the role of digital transformation in promoting sustainable tourism development in Algeria under the framework of the Tourism Master Plan. Specifically, it seeks to analyze how digital technologies can enhance competitiveness, efficiency, and sustainability in the tourism sector. The study also aims to identify the challenges and barriers that hinder the integration of digital practices within tourism strategies. Furthermore, it strives to propose practical mechanisms and policy recommendations to align digital transformation initiatives with sustainable development goals.

## **2. Digital Transformation, Definition, benefits, and objectives**

Digital transformation refers to the integration of digital technologies into various sectors, fundamentally reshaping processes, services, and customer experiences. Its importance lies in delivering numerous benefits such as efficiency, innovation, and competitiveness, while its objectives focus on achieving sustainable growth and improved value creation.

### **2.1. Digital Transformation Definition:**

Digital Transformation refers to the process of leveraging digital technologies to create, modify, or enhance business processes, culture, customer experiences, and overall organizational operations to meet changing business and market demands. It involves integrating advanced digital tools, such as artificial intelligence (AI), cloud computing, big data, the Internet of Things (IoT), and automation, to streamline workflows, improve decision-making, increase efficiency, and foster innovation. Digital transformation is not just about adopting new technologies; it also requires a shift in mindset, organizational culture, and strategy to remain competitive in a digital-first world (E Project., 2019).

Digital Transformation also refers to the process by which an Organization adopts Digital tools, software, and applications in its various activities to create or modify services, products, procedures, and processes by converting its operational system into a Digital format. (Mirzagayeva & Heydar , 2022, pp. 10-21). This strategic initiative integrates Digital technology across all areas of the Organization and is often referred to as the digitization of its functions. The primary aim is to create value through the continuous large-scale deployment of technology.. It is a long-term effort

to determine how the Organization can continuously improve and change. This is because technology has not only become more integrated into Business, but it is also constantly evolving, so the Organization must work on constantly renewing and updating to keep up with Digital and technological changes .(McKinsey & Company, 2023).

**2.2 Digital Transformation Importance:**

The table highlights the importance of digital transformation by presenting six key features that organizations can achieve through this process:

Moreover, it strengthens customer satisfaction, improves workflows, ensures continuous availability, and even performs risky tasks safely—ultimately driving productivity, competitiveness, and sustainable growth.

- **Technology:** Represents the digital infrastructure and tools that support process and service development.
- **Communication:** Refers to the use of digital means to enhance communication channels between individuals, organizations, and customers.

- **Data:** Highlights the role of big data and analytics in making accurate decisions and improving organizational performance.
- **Internet of Things (IoT):** Connects devices and systems via the internet to exchange information intelligently and in real time.
- **Automation:** Involves using technology and robotics to simplify repetitive tasks and increase efficiency.
- **AI (Artificial Intelligence):** Emphasizes AI's role in prediction, service improvement, and customer experience personalization.
- **Networking:** Shows the importance of digital networks in connecting systems and people to create an integrated work environment.

### **3. Tourism (concept, forms, benefits and value chain):**

Tourism represents one of the most dynamic sectors contributing to cultural exchange, economic growth, and social development. Exploring this topic requires addressing its fundamental concept, the different forms it takes across contexts, and the essential requirements needed to ensure its sustainability and effectiveness. This comprehensive approach provides a clear understanding of tourism's multifaceted role in today's world.

#### **3.1. The concept of tourism**

- **Tourism is** a social, cultural and economic phenomenon that entails the movement of people to countries or places outside their usual environment for personal or business/professional purposes. These people are called visitors (which may be either tourists or excursionists; residents or non-residents) and tourism has to do with their activities, some of which imply tourism expenditure." This definition highlights tourism as a multifaceted phenomenon involving movement, activity, and economic impact (BCcampus, 2024)& (UN Tourism, 2025).

- **Tourism is** a dynamic, evolving industry characterized by travel for pleasure, cultural exchange, education, and business, increasingly driven by technology such as AI and smart systems to enhance the traveler experience. It encompasses socially and environmentally responsible practices aiming for sustainable development, balancing economic growth with the preservation of natural and cultural heritage. Tourism now includes diverse forms like experiential, transformative, educational, and eco-tourism, reflecting changing traveler preferences and global socio-economic trends (Jong, 2025), (Sábio, 2024).

- **Tourism includes** niche forms such as scientific tourism, motivated by the pursuit of scientific knowledge and participation in scientific studies, expanding traditional mass tourism concepts into specialized market segments (Bourlon, 2023).

These definitions together provide a broad, comprehensive understanding of tourism as a social, economic, cultural and scientific phenomenon studied across disciplines and promoted by international entities like UNWTO. If preferred, the UNWTO official definition is considered authoritative and widely accepted globally.

#### **3.2. Forms of tourism**

Tourism takes various forms depending on its objectives, motivations, and types of destinations. Traditional forms include ecotourism, cultural, rural, health and wellness, gastronomic, and business tourism. Modern forms have also emerged, such as digital nomad tourism, tech tourism, set-jetting, and ethical or indigenous tourism. International studies and reports highlight the growing importance of sustainable tourism, which balances economic, environmental, and social dimensions, especially in the post-pandemic era. The main forms of tourism can be summarized as follows:

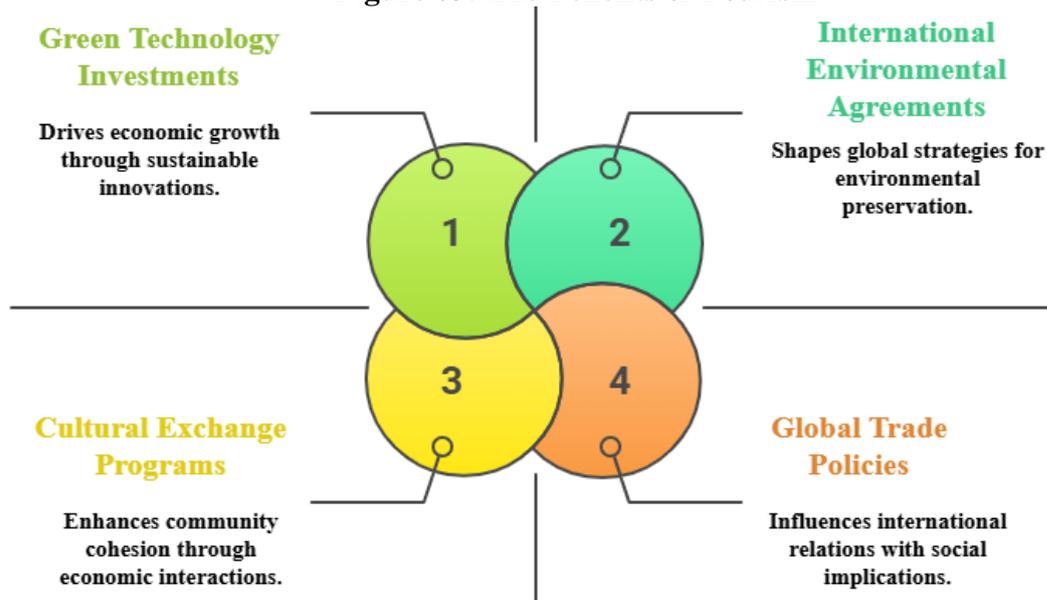

Its multifaceted contributions go beyond leisure and travel, promoting sustainable development, fostering intercultural exchange, and supporting local communities. The key benefits of tourism can be presented as follows:

- **Economic Importance:** Tourism is a key driver of global economic growth. In 2024, it accounted for approximately 10% of the global economy, contributing \$10.9 trillion to GDP and supporting 357 million jobs worldwide—roughly one in every ten jobs. It fosters productivity, inclusive employment, MSME growth, and innovation. Tourism also stimulates related sectors such as handicrafts, retail, and hospitality, generating foreign exchange, investment, and tax revenues. When properly managed, it can expand markets for local products, benefiting disadvantaged and remote communities (WBG, 2025), (WTTC, 2024).

- **Social and Cultural Benefits:** Tourism creates employment and income opportunities that enhance community wellbeing. It supports the preservation and revitalization of cultural heritage, local traditions, arts, and crafts. Tourism encourages intercultural dialogue, community pride, and social exchange between visitors and hosts. Additionally, it drives improvements in social infrastructure, including roads, public transport, and services that benefit both locals and visitors (Wikipedia, 2025) , (Tourism Teacher, 2023).

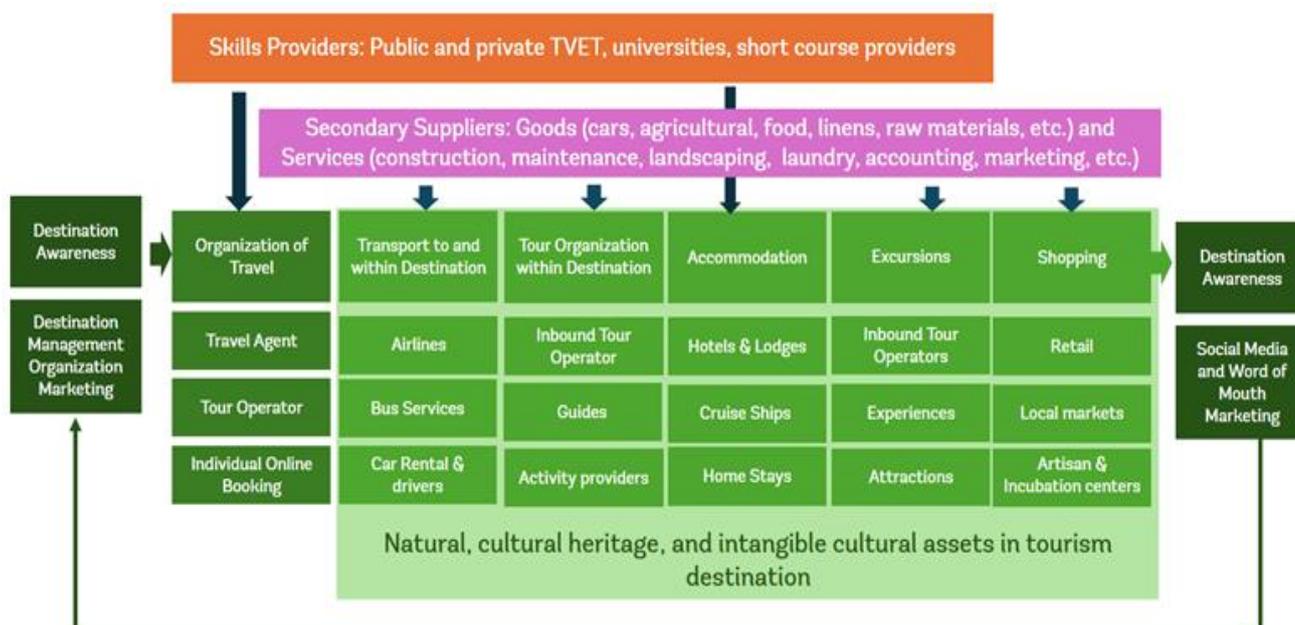
- **Environmental and Sustainable Development:** Sustainable tourism promotes biodiversity conservation, heritage protection, and climate-friendly livelihoods, contributing to the green economy. Cooperation in tourism can enhance urban public health infrastructure, improve environmental quality, and support health-related industries such as wellness and medical tourism (Liang , Guolei , & Chen , 2025).

- **Policy and Global Importance:** International organizations—including the OECD, WTO, World Bank, and WTTC—highlight tourism’s role in inclusive growth, innovation, environmental sustainability, and regional development. Modern tourism policies increasingly integrate ecosystem preservation, social equity, and economic resilience (WTTC, 2025), (OECD , 2024).

Tourism is a powerful catalyst for economic prosperity, job creation, cultural preservation, social development, and environmental sustainability when carefully managed and guided by sound policies.

### 3.4. The tourism value chain

The tourism value chain is a conceptual framework that captures the interrelated activities, sectors, and stakeholders that collectively generate value within the tourism industry. It is essential for understanding how the industry operates as an integrated system, where each component contributes to enhancing the overall tourist experience, maximizing economic benefits, and promoting sustainable development. The value chain emphasizes not only the end product—tourism experiences—but also the processes, relationships, and infrastructure that support it (WBG, 2025) :

**3.4.1. Destination Awareness:** Destination awareness refers to the mechanisms through which potential tourists become informed about a destination. This includes marketing campaigns, strategic branding, media exposure, and destination management initiatives. Effective destination awareness shapes tourist perceptions, influences decision-making, and determines the attractiveness and competitiveness of a location. In the digital era, awareness is increasingly mediated through online platforms, travel review websites, and social media channels, which significantly impact tourist behavior.

**3.4.2. Transportation to the Destination:** Transportation encompasses all modes of travel that enable tourists to reach their chosen destination, including air travel, rail, road, and maritime transport. Accessibility is a key determinant of destination competitiveness. Investments in modern, reliable, and sustainable transport infrastructure not only facilitate the movement of tourists but also expand market reach and enhance the economic multiplier effect of tourism activities.

**3.4.3. Accommodation:** Accommodation services provide the essential infrastructure for tourists to stay at their destinations. This sector ranges from luxury hotels to budget lodges, guesthouses, and alternative lodging options such as homestays and short-term rentals. High-quality accommodation contributes to visitor satisfaction, lengthens stay durations, and generates significant revenue. Moreover, it stimulates local employment and supports allied services, including housekeeping, food and beverage, and facility management.

**3.4.5. Activities and Excursions:** Activities and excursions represent the core experiential component of tourism. They include guided tours, adventure sports, cultural events, heritage visits, and recreational programs. These experiences enhance the attractiveness of destinations and directly influence tourist satisfaction and repeat visitation. Furthermore, they contribute to local economic diversification by supporting specialized service providers, cultural practitioners, and small-scale entrepreneurs.

**3.4.6. Tourist Shopping:** Tourist shopping encompasses all points of purchase where visitors acquire goods, souvenirs, crafts, and other products. This component not only adds to the economic impact of tourism but also supports the preservation of local culture, artisanal skills, and small-scale manufacturing. Strategic integration of shopping into tourism experiences can reinforce destination branding and create additional revenue streams for communities.

**3.4.7. Digital Marketing and Social Media Engagement:** Modern tourism heavily relies on digital platforms for promotion, engagement, and influence. Social media marketing allows destinations to communicate directly with potential tourists, showcase experiences, and shape perceptions. Platforms such as Instagram, Facebook, TikTok, and travel review websites are pivotal in creating awareness, enhancing brand image, and influencing travelers' choices in highly competitive markets.

**3.4.8. Skilled Human Capital and Service Providers :** The development of human capital is foundational to the tourism value chain. Skilled personnel, trained through professional institutions and vocational programs, ensure the delivery of high-quality services across all sectors of tourism. From hospitality staff to tour guides, transport operators, and cultural facilitators, the competency and professionalism of human resources directly impact visitor satisfaction, destination reputation, and long-term sustainability.

The tourism value chain is most effective when these components operate in an integrated, coordinated manner. Synergies between marketing, transport, accommodation, activities, and skilled services create a comprehensive ecosystem that maximizes economic returns, enriches visitor experiences, and fosters sustainable development. Policymakers, industry leaders, and destination managers must recognize these interdependencies to optimize investment, enhance competitiveness, and ensure the resilience of the tourism sector in an increasingly dynamic global environment.

#### **4. The Tourism Development Master Plan "Vision 2030" in Algeria :**

The Tourism Development Master Plan "Vision 2030" in Algeria was officially launched on August 6, 2015, as a strategic framework outlining the country's long-term directions for the tourism sector. The plan aims to position Algeria as a leading global tourist destination and strengthen tourism's role as an alternative economic pillar to the hydrocarbon sector by revitalizing the national tourism activity, developing tourism products, and enhancing service quality (MTA Ager, 2023).

The project **mobilizes all stakeholders in the tourism sector** from both the public and private sectors, aiming to utilize available tourism resources and achieve sustainable development while maintaining a balance between economic, social, and environmental dimensions (ادير و غزالي، 2019), (DIDOUCHE, 2024).

The plan is based on **comprehensive developmental strategies and initiatives** that promote local and foreign investment, improve the quality of tourism services, and enhance tourism products, with a strong emphasis on coordination among various relevant government entities, led by the Ministry of Tourism and Traditional Industry of Algeria.

Government officials, including Minister of Tourism **Houria Madahi**, have emphasized the importance of the plan and its objectives in supporting the sector and achieving a qualitative leap in Algerian tourism, reflecting the state's vision to enhance Algeria's position on the global tourism map (Madahi, 2024).

**4.1.Objectives of the Master Plan for Tourism Development "Vision 2030" in Algeria :**

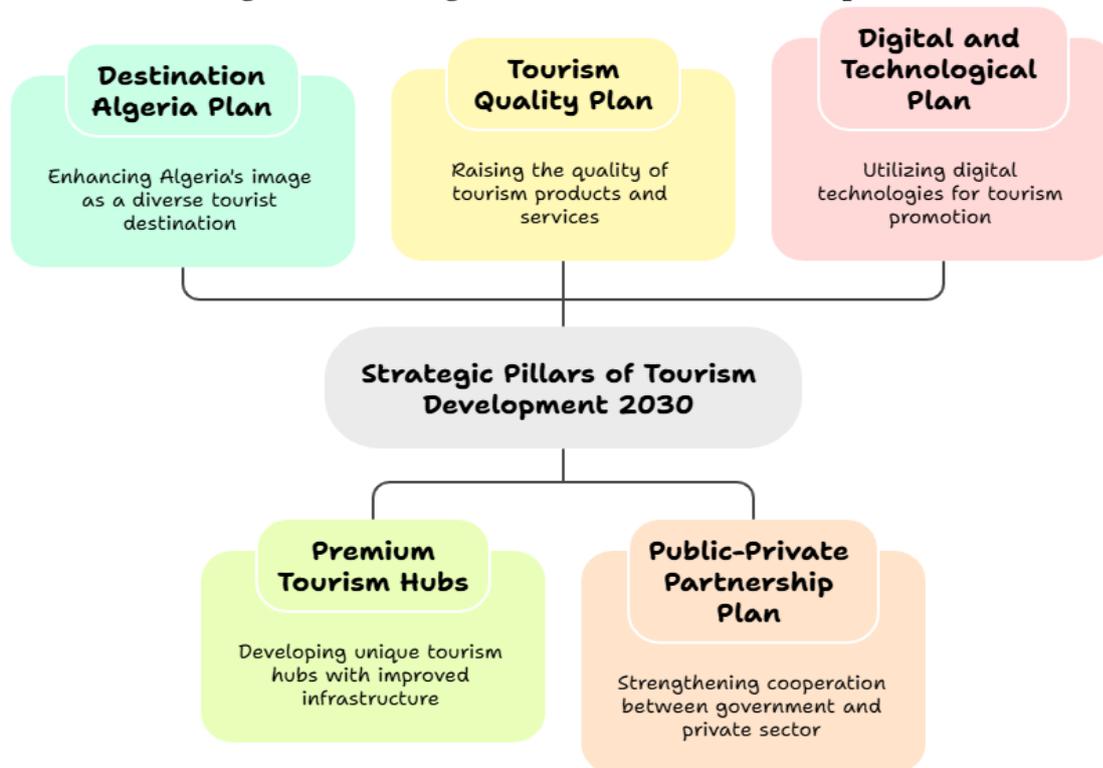
The Tourism Development Master Plan “Vision 2030” aims to establish a comprehensive framework for developing the tourism sector in Algeria over the long term, with a focus on economic, environmental, and social sustainability. This framework encompasses a set of detailed objectives designed to strengthen tourism’s role as a driver of economic growth, support related sectors, preserve cultural and natural heritage, and enhance Algeria’s international image, while promoting investment and achieving balanced regional development. The following outlines the main areas and strategic objectives on which the plan is based:

**- Tourism Quality Plan:**

**- Public-Private Partnership Plan:**

- Strengthen cooperation between government authorities and the private sector to enhance investment and service delivery.
- Encourage joint initiatives for investment in new tourism projects and expand their scope.

**- Digital and Technological Plan:**

- Utilize digital technologies and marketing to improve tourism promotion and attract new tourist segments.
- Adopt technological solutions to enhance visitor experience and streamline tourism services effectively.

These strategies form the foundation of the master plan, aiming to achieve sustainable tourism development, enhance Algeria’s global competitiveness, diversify tourism products and services, stimulate investment, and build specialized human capacities in the tourism sector.

### 4.3. What has been achieved from the Vision 2030 plan since its launch?

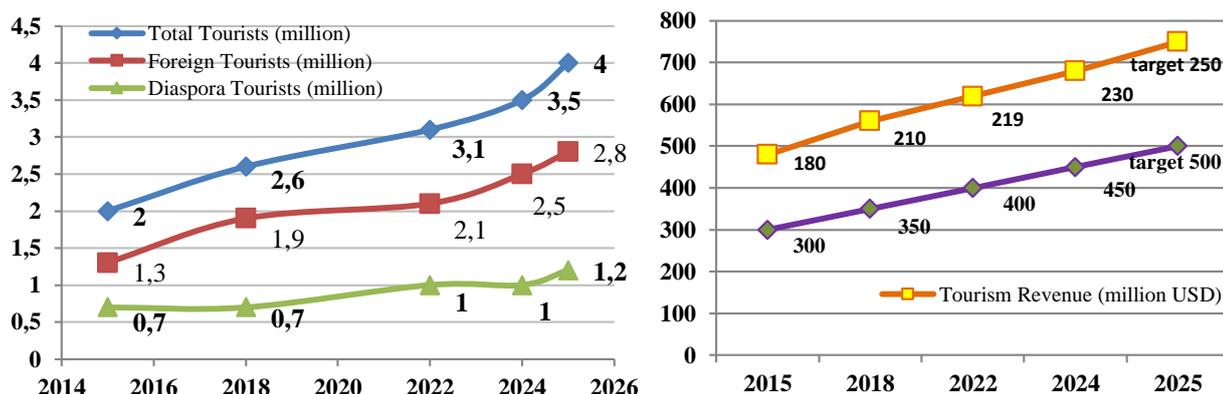

Since the launch of the Tourism Master Plan **Vision 2030** in Algeria in **2015**, statistics reflect a significant development in the tourism sector in terms of tourist numbers, employment opportunities, and revenues, as follows:

**- Total, Foreign, and Diaspora Tourists:**The total number of tourists increased from 2.0 million in **2015** to approximately 3.5 million in 2024, with a projected rise to 4.0 million in 2025.

The number of foreign tourists rose notably from 1.3 million to 2.5 million in 2024, reflecting the success of international promotion efforts for Algerian destinations.

Tourists from the national diaspora abroad have remained relatively stable at around 1.0 million since 2022, with a slight projected increase to 1.2 million in 2025.

**-Employment Opportunities:**The plan contributed to creating approximately 450,000 direct and indirect jobs by 2024, compared to 300,000 in 2015, demonstrating the tourism sector’s impact on the national labor market and skills development.

Employment opportunities are expected to reach 500,000 in 2025, reflecting ongoing investments in hotel and service infrastructure.

**-Tourism Revenues:** Tourism revenues increased from approximately USD 180 million in 2015 to over USD 210 million in 2024, with a projected growth to USD 250 million in 2025.

This gradual growth indicates the plan’s effectiveness in transforming tourism into an alternative economic driver beyond traditional resources such as hydrocarbons.

**-Infrastructure Development and Investments:** New tourist areas have been developed, modern hotels established, and domestic and international investment delegations attracted. The expansion of infrastructure has contributed to improving visitor experiences and increasing the capacity of tourist destinations.

In addition to the achievements mentioned earlier, the Vision 2030 plan has also realized significant progress in the approval of projects and the development of tourist areas (زروقي و كاري ، (شنة و شريفي، 2022)، (APS, 2025), (2025):

**- Approved Projects and Tourist Area Development :** Over 170 tourism development plans have been officially approved.

- Twenty new areas have been designated for tourism expansion.
- Ten new tourist zones have been fully developed, including the rehabilitation and upgrading of existing tourism properties

**- Hotel and Tourism Projects:**

- A total of 746 tourism projects have been registered, including ongoing projects, newly launched initiatives, and projects currently on hold at varying stages of implementation.
- The number of hotels and available accommodation has increased substantially, with thousands of new beds added across major tourism hubs such as the Mishal East and Mishal Central poles.

**- Sustainable Development and Focus on Eco-Tourism:**

- Intensive efforts have been made to preserve environmental, cultural and heritage diversity within the framework of sustainable tourism.
- Field studies and analytical assessments indicate tangible progress in applying sustainable development principles in Algeria’s tourism sector.

These developments reflect the systematic efforts of Vision 2030 to enhance Algeria’s tourism infrastructure, diversify its offerings, increase the sector’s capacity to accommodate growing numbers of domestic and international tourists, and ensure the sustainable management of environmental and cultural resources.

#### **4.4.The 2030 Tourism Plan in Algeria: Implementation Challenges and Possible Solutions :**

The successful implementation of Algeria’s Tourism Development Master Plan 2030 faces a range of challenges that may affect the achievement of its strategic objectives. These challenges span infrastructure deficiencies, administrative and bureaucratic hurdles, limited investment, underutilization of tourism potential, environmental concerns, and regional disparities. Addressing these obstacles requires comprehensive solutions, including investment in infrastructure, streamlined administrative procedures, human resource development, sustainable tourism policies, and effective monitoring and evaluation mechanisms. The following table highlights the key implementation challenges and proposes actionable solutions to ensure the plan’s objectives are met:

### **5.The general context of the relationship between digital transformation and tourism promotion in the 2030 plan.**

### 5.1. Digital Transformation Tools for Supporting Sustainable Tourism

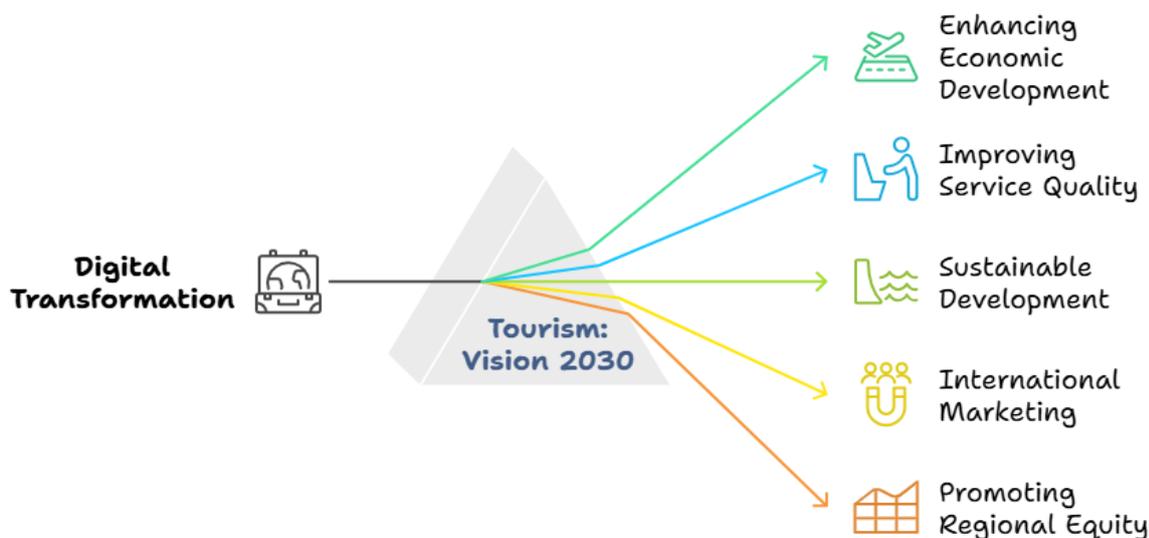

For example, digital applications can accelerate booking processes and reduce human errors, leading to increased productivity and lower costs.

The study also shows that digital transformation contributes to enhancing the quality of services provided to tourists. Through the use of digital platforms and smart applications, visitor experiences can be improved by offering more personalized and faster services. Providing accurate real-time information to tourists further increases satisfaction and the likelihood of return visits.

Moreover, the research demonstrates that digital transformation can support sustainable tourism practices through technologies such as Geographic Information Systems (GIS) and the Internet of Things (IoT) for monitoring natural resources. These solutions enable better resource management, reducing the environmental impact of tourism activities and preserving cultural and natural heritage.

The results also indicate that digital transformation strengthens the competitiveness of the tourism sector by improving international marketing and raising awareness of Algerian destinations. Utilizing social media and digital marketing can attract new tourist segments and enhance Algeria's global image as a distinguished tourism destination.

It acts as an enabling factor that integrates economic, social, and environmental dimensions, enhances the sector's competitiveness, improves service quality, and ensures alignment with the strategic objectives of the Tourism Master Plan Vision 2030.*

- Enhance sustainable tourism practices: Implement GIS and IoT systems for environmental monitoring, ensuring responsible use of natural and cultural resources, and promoting eco-tourism initiatives.
- Strengthen international marketing: Develop coordinated digital marketing campaigns using social media, virtual tours, and influencer partnerships to improve Algeria's global visibility and attract diverse tourist segments.
- Encourage public-private partnerships: Foster collaboration between government agencies, private investors, and local communities to fund innovative tourism projects and enhance service quality.
- Monitor and evaluate digital initiatives: Establish continuous monitoring and evaluation mechanisms to assess the impact of digital transformation on sustainable tourism outcomes and make data-driven adjustments.
